BIBLE STUDY WITH PASTOR STARK: Song of Solomon

Beginning Sunday, November 3rd at 9:30 a.m. Most folks will be more familiar with it as Song of Solomon, for thus it is entitled in both the King James and Revised Standard Versions of the Bible.
